the journey i was able to embark on thanks to the owhc young travelling scholarship took me through five cities that could hardly be more different: porto, regensburg, philadelphia, new york city, and amsterdam. each of these cities brought its own atmosphere, history, and architecture, yet they shared a common thread: the fascinating interplay between the city, its architecture, and the people who bring it to life.

the city as a stage, the people as actors

porto was the starting point of my journey. the hilly city, with its winding alleys and impressive blend of traditional and modern architecture, felt like a living theater. i was particularly struck by the contrast between the old houses adorned with azulejos and the bold designs of álvaro siza or the contemporary rem koolhaas. here, the city itself became a stage where daily life played out in all its authenticity.

regensburg, a medieval city with an impressive historic fabric, provided a stark contrast. the old town seemed almost like a frozen moment in time, yet the flow of people breathed new life into its centuries-old streets. it was fascinating to observe how modern life and historical settings coexisted harmoniously – a dance between tradition and the present.

philadelphia and **new york city** opened an entirely different chapter: the pulsating metropolises of the usa were overflowing with dynamism, diversity, and contradictions. in philadelphia, the "cradle of democracy," i admired the balance between historical landmarks like independence hall and modern skyscrapers. new york, on the other hand, was pure spectacle. here, the city became a stage for the most diverse people and scenarios. the architectural variety was breathtaking: from the iconic skyscrapers of manhattan to unique neighborhoods like brooklyn – every corner had its own story and energy.

amsterdam marked the end of my journey and surprised me with its human scale. the compact city, crisscrossed by canals, exuded calm and openness. the combination of traditional brickwork, modern architecture, and innovative urban planning – such as in ijburg – offered a perfect conclusion to my travels

unforeseen moments and the role of architecture

what touched me most about this journey were the unexpected situations that constantly arose. a chance encounter with a local, a spontaneous detour into a side street, or an unanticipated perspective on a building – all these moments felt like improvised scenes in a play. the architecture served as the backdrop, sometimes dominating, sometimes subtle, but always present.

each city had its own way of bringing people together and enabling interaction. whether it was a square acting as a meeting point or an inconspicuous alley suddenly becoming a lively gathering place, this versatility of the city and its architecture left a lasting impression on me.

photography with an analog camera – preserving the moment

a special aspect of my journey was the decision to capture impressions with an analog camera. in an era where digital photography and smartphones are readily available, analog photography holds a unique value. it forces you to perceive the moment more consciously and compose each shot carefully. every frame was deliberate – a process that made me engage more deeply with the subject.


the analog camera also gave me a sense of patience and surprise. the results were not immediately visible, and that was where the magic lay. when i later held the developed pictures in my hands, it felt like reliving the journey – the images told stories that went beyond the purely visual.

the photos now displayed in the exhibition are not just memories of the cities i visited, but also of the countless encounters and moments that shaped me on this journey.

conclusion

the journey with the owho young travelling scholarship was far more than a geographical discovery tour for me. it was an intense engagement with architecture, people, and the myriad unexpected scenarios that define urban life. every city had its own story to tell, and i was privileged to be a part of it – through exploring streets, observing life, or capturing these fleeting moments on film.


it was a journey that enriched me not only academically as an architecture student but also personally, and one i will always cherish.




